This month we want to discuss the issue of security. A few weeks ago, we had someone attempt to come to a show under the guise of being a RedCoat volunteer. Thanks to the attentiveness of one of our newer RedCoats, this person was pointed out to a House Manager and Security was alerted and escorted him out. Thankfully, in this case he was only trying to gain access to a show and left willingly.

With Hamilton coming in the summer, our security team believes that we could have this happen again as people may attempt to test our protocols to see how difficult it would be to gain access in this way. We are asking that if you see something suspicious that you alert a House Manager.

Additionally, **Head Ushers** – when you are helping at sign-in, please ask to see the photo ID of any RedCoats that you don't recognize. Every RedCoat should have the new vertical photo IDs at this point.

#### Qualifications:

- Minimum one year experience as a volunteer
- 90% attendance or better
- Able to work upstairs and downstairs; good knowledge of all the theaters
- Dependable, self-motivated, team player, excellent communication and problem solving skills
- Able to remain for the entire performance

#### Responsibilities:

- Check in 15 minutes before regular volunteers for the pre-show Head Usher briefing
- Follow designated policies and procedures as specified by the House Manager
- Be vigilant of potential safety issues
- Supervise pre-show and end of performance volunteer duties
- Team leader for volunteers in assigned area
- Ensure all equipment is returned to designated areas

It is important to remember that Head Usher duties still include seating and assisting guests. # Social Media Guidelines

The Playhouse Square Marketing Department has sent over Media Guidelines for all employees and volunteers. This is especially important with Hamilton on the horizon.

#### Employee and Volunteer Policy: Social Media and Media

#### SOCIAL MEDIA

You, the staff and volunteers of Playhouse Square, are an extension of our brand and represent the face, voice and integrity of our organization. We love when you share the great things happening at Playhouse Square on your personal social media platforms. However, posts that are based on opinion or speculation on any topic are not permitted. Always use sound judgement and when in doubt, check with the Marketing Department. The best way to share Playhouse Square content is to follow us on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and YouTube, then retweet, share and like what you see there.

- Don't use social media to discuss Playhouse Square issues unless they have been externally announced or publicized. Not sure what's OK to share? You are welcome to share posts made by Playhouse Square on our official channels on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and YouTube.
- If you are privy to Playhouse Square information that has not been made public, keep it confidential.
- Be cautious when commenting on social media posts about Playhouse Square, shows coming to Playhouse Square and other topics related to the organization. If you are identified as an employee of Playhouse Square, the media may consider your comment an official response. If you see a post that you feel needs to be addressed by the organization, please forward to Marketing for review.

#### **MEDIA**

The staff of the Playhouse Square Marketing Department is responsible for all communications to the media. These include written, digital and verbal communications, as well as on-camera commentary or interviews. To protect our brand, members of the Marketing Department, along with pre-approved spokespersons, are the only staff members permitted to interact with the media. When approached by a member of the media (including camera operators), staff and volunteers should not:

- Provide information, opinion or comment via email or phone
- Comment or answer questions in person or on camera

Please note that the media may approach you with questions that seem "innocent." This tactic is designed to bring you into a conversation that leads to other questions, or to manipulate you into providing an opinion. Any statement you make may be quoted, so use your best judgment.

<u>Should you receive a call or email from a member of the media, or be approached in person by a reporter or news camera, your easiest response could be:</u> I will direct you to a member of our marketing and communications department.

Should a camera crew or reporter with a camera or recording device approach you inside any of our facilities during a show, please direct them to the Front of House Manager. (Note that cameras and reporters are permitted **outside** of our property, but please do still advise the FOH Manager of the situation). At other times, please call 216-771-4444 and ask for Cindi Szymanski, Jason Swank or Autumn Kiser. At times, the marketing staff will schedule non-media film crews to tape on our behalf and may also grant access to news crews. When they do, a form is completed in advance and circulated to the House Managers. In nearly all cases, media and nonmedia camera crews will be accompanied by a member of the marketing and communications department. However, it is always better to err on the side of caution by notifying the FOH Manager.

# Monthly Improvement Focus

**Cultural Sensitivity** is the area for improvement we are focusing on for the month of March. Here at Playhouse Square we welcome a wide range of guests and many of our guests may have a different ethnicity, religion, background etc. from

you and other RedCoats. It is important to remember that these people are our guests and we should extend the same hospitality to all of them. We have a few notes below to help with this issue:

- **Do not make comments about guests to anyone**. At a recent show some guests overheard RedCoats saying some unfortunate comments about the race of them and other people attending the show. This is completely inappropriate and cannot occur.
- Remember that our accessible restrooms are also our gender neutral restrooms. There are many reasons that someone might not feel comfortable using the traditional restrooms, you are welcome to point them out, but if someone chooses to use the accessible restrooms, you should not ask them to move.
- Try to not take offense at the comments or actions of guests. Occasionally we receive comments that RedCoats feel they have been treated poorly by a guest. While this can be hurtful, keep in mind that sometimes cultural differences can obscure someone's intention. Perhaps their action or comment is not seen as negative in their culture and they are not aware of how it comes across to you.
- **Do not make negative comments about performances to guests.** Please do not talk to guests about what you did not enjoy about the performance, and do not support their negative comments by agreeing with them or telling them that other guests have not like the performance.

Everywhere we go we encounter people that are different than we are, and we are thankful that Playhouse Square attracts such a wide range of guests and performances. It is our responsibility as the face of Playhouse Square to make each guest feel as welcomed as the next to make Playhouse Square a positive experience for all.
