In the Spotlight: Guest Experience – The Importance of First Impressions

You've heard the saying, "You only have one opportunity to make a first impression." While it may be a cliché, it is true. The initial impression can set the tone for the entire experience.

First impressions last! Whether they are accurate or not, it normally takes a long time and concerted effort to change a first impression.

Because first impressions are largely subconscious, they are very persistent – even in the face of contrary evidence. Due to our implicit and cognitive biases, we see the world and other people through our own set of filters and make decisions based on them. All of your relationships are affected by that first impression.

MAKE A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION

Tips for making a good first impression:

- Meet & Greet Make eye contact, smile, offer a sincere welcome, never ignore the guest.
- Presentation Dress to impress (well-groomed appearance, clean uniform), welcoming body language, and ensure the area around you is clean and tidy.
- 3. **Positive Attitude** exude enthusiasm; be ready to offer friendly, helpful service.




