ROAD CLOSURES

- Euclid Avenue closed between E. 13th and E. 17th
- E. 14th Street closed between Prospect and Euclid Avenue
- **Enter and exit the US Bank Garage on Prospect only!**

ACCESSIBLE DROP-OFF and VALET PARKING for Theater Guests

- Will be located at the corner of Euclid Avenue and E. 17th Street
- Turn south on E. 17th from Chester Avenue for accessible drop-off and valet parking
- If you are assigned to wheelchairs – please head to E. 17th and Euclid to meet guests.

FESTIVAL SECURITY

- Anyone entering the festival footprint will have to pass through Playhouse Square security checkpoint entrances. Pass-through pedestrian traffic to avoid the security check-points is maintained on the North Euclid Ave. sidewalk.

Encore will serve experiential cocktails in an intimate, upscale lounge located on the ground floor of The Lumen (1580 Euclid Ave).

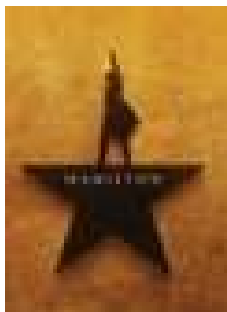

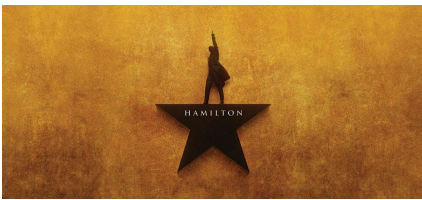
