Cleveland, OH – (*September 30, 2025*) Playhouse Square announced today that tickets to the touring Broadway productions of *Mrs. Doubtfire* and *Meredith Willson's The Music Man* will be available for purchase beginning Wednesday, October 1, 2025, at 10 a.m. Both shows are part of the 2025-2026 Broadway in Akron series, a collaboration between Playhouse Square and the University of Akron and will take the stage at E.J. Everyone's favorite Scottish nanny is headed to **Akron** on January 20 - 21, 2026 in this internationally acclaimed hit musical critics call "wonderful, heart-warming, and laugh-out-loud funny" (*Manchester Evening News*) and "a feel-good, family-friendly comedy that delivers" (*The Hollywood Reporter*). Based on the beloved film, *Mrs. Doubtfire* tells the hysterical and heartfelt story of an out-of-work actor who will do anything for his kids.
